1530s, from Latin *accomodatus* "suitable," pp. of *accomodare* "make fit, adapt, fit one thing to another," from *ad-* "to" (see **ad-**) + *commodare* "make fit," from *commodus* "fit" (see **commode**). Related: *Accommodated*; **accommodating**.
